Candidates running to represent the Parent Organizations

Parent organization: The Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of British Columbia (APEGBC)

Tony Gillett, P.Eng.

I am standing as a candidate for APEGBC representative to the CSAP Board. I have 25 years of contaminated sites consulting experience in BC addressing a wide variety of remote, rural and urban sites, and have been a standards Approved Professional since 2004. I have completed a dozen submissions for numerical and risk based instruments. I regularly attend CSAP, MoE and industry association professional development events. I have served on the CSAP Membership and Professional Development committees currently act as a pod leader (facilitating communication with the membership) and have participated in the development of CSAP examination. If elected, I would look forward to working with other CSAP board members and the membership at large to continue the excellent work of the current and previous boards in engaging in meaningful collaboration between the Society, MoE, Industry and other stakeholders to further advance a practical, sciencebased approach to managing contaminated sites in BC.
