

DECLARATION ACT

- The Declaration Act Declaration of Rights of Indigenous Peoples Act received Royal Assent on November 28, 2019.
- Provides for agreements to be entered into with a wider range of Indigenous governing bodies, including agreements relating to the exercise of a statutory power of decision.




