
The site covered by this Certificate of Compliance is located at 310 Legion Drive, Quesnel, British Columbia which is more particularly known and described as:

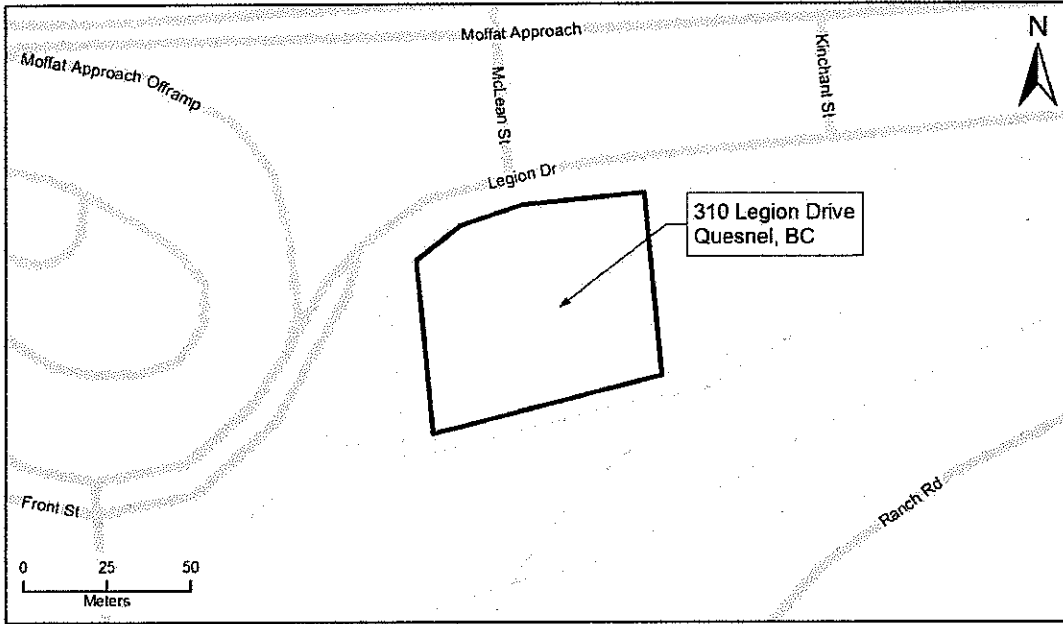

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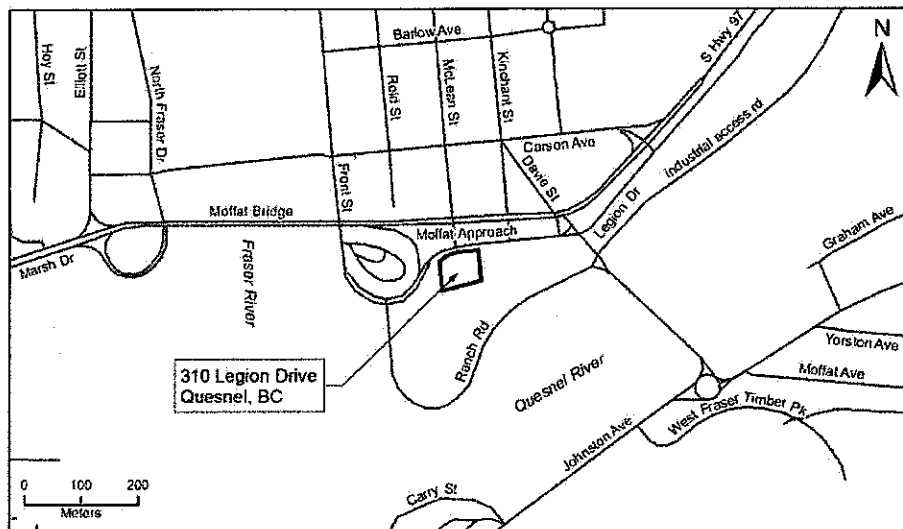

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Site Plan

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Schedule B

Requirements and Conditions

1. Any changes in land, vapour, or water uses must be promptly identified by the responsible person in a written submission to the Director. An application for an amendment or new Certificate of Compliance may be necessary. The uses to which this condition applies are described in Schedule C and in the site investigation documents listed in Schedule D.

The documents listed in Schedule D indicate that vapour attenuation factors were applied to meet Contaminated Sites Regulation numerical standards at the site. These vapour attenuation factors were selected based on assumptions about the structures, locations and depths of buildings expected at the site or adjacent property. These assumptions include the following:


- (a) A slab-on-grade building.

Any inconsistencies that arise between the structures, locations and depths of proposed or constructed buildings at and adjacent to the site and the range of structures, locations and depths of buildings assumed in the selection of vapour attenuation factors in the documents listed in Schedule D must be promptly identified by the responsible person or persons in a written submission to the Director. An application for an amendment or new Certificate of Compliance may be necessary.

2. The principal risk controls which must be present or implemented and must be maintained at the site include the following:
 - a) Subsurface soil contamination remaining at depths greater than 1 m below ground surface at the Site should not be redistributed as surface soil to limit potential exposures to human and terrestrial ecological receptors.
 - b) Fruit or nut trees and edible vegetation should not be introduced on the Site in order to limit potential exposures to human receptors.
 - c) Deep rooting vegetation should not be introduced on the Site in order to limit potential exposures to subsurface soil and groundwater contamination.
3. If requested by the Director, the responsible person must provide a signed statement indicating whether the principal risk controls listed in clause 2 of this Schedule have been and continue to be met. This may include providing a signed statement by an Approved Professional.
4. Performance verification must be undertaken as specified in the Performance Verification Plan listed in Schedule D or as specified in a modification of the plan approved by the Director.

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

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5. The Director must be notified promptly by the persons responsible for the site if performance verification actions indicate that any institutional controls required in clause 2 of this Schedule are not being met. The following information must be submitted to the Director with the notification, or as soon as practicable thereafter:
 - (a) The time period over which institutional controls did not meet the requirements of Schedule B;
 - (b) The nature of the excursion;
 - (c) The temporary or permanent corrective measures implemented or to be implemented;
 - (d) An implementation schedule; and
 - (e) Supporting documentation.

6. If requested by the Director, a report signed by an Approved Professional must be submitted for review to the Director and must include the following:
 - (a) An evaluation of the performance of the institutional controls;
 - (b) Recommendations for modification of any plans referenced above, along with supporting rationale;
 - (c) Interpretation of current and cumulative results of the performance verification actions undertaken according to the plan described in clause 4 above; and
 - (d) Supporting documentation.

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Schedule C

Substances and Uses

Substances remediated in soil for commercial land soil use:

To meet risk-based remediation standards:

- Arsenic;
- Ethylbenzene, and xylene;
- LEPHs, VPHs; and
- Naphthalene.

Substances remediated in water for freshwater aquatic life water use:

To meet numerical remediation standards:


- Arsenic, cadmium, and selenium;
- Benzene, ethylbenzene, and toluene;
- EPHw₁₀₋₁₉, and VPHw, and
- Acenaphthene, anthracene, benzo[a]anthracene, benzo[a]pyrene, chrysene, fluoranthene, fluorene, naphthalene, phenanthrene and pyrene.

To meet risk-based remediation standards:

- LEPHw.
